When we purchase a product on any e-commerce site and the product is not up to the mark, there is a return policy and a refund within 15 days.

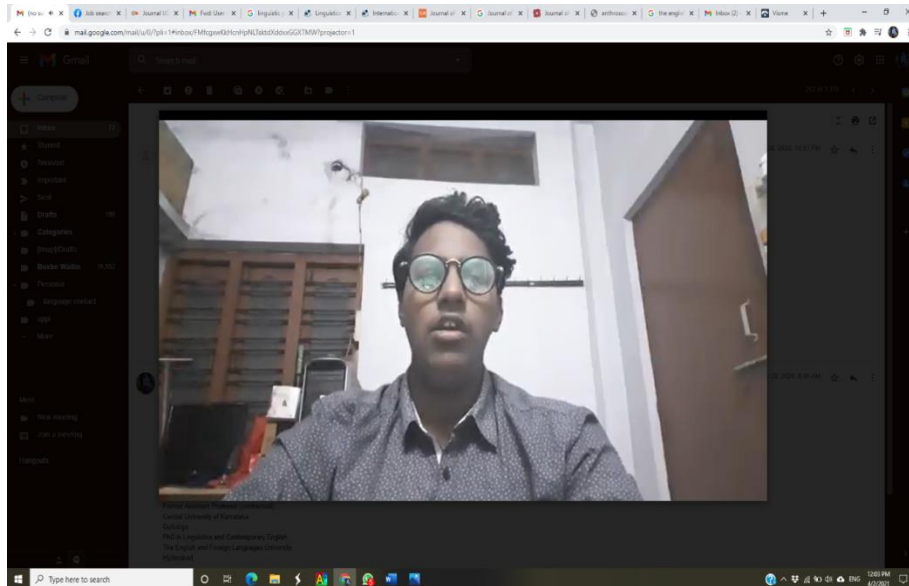

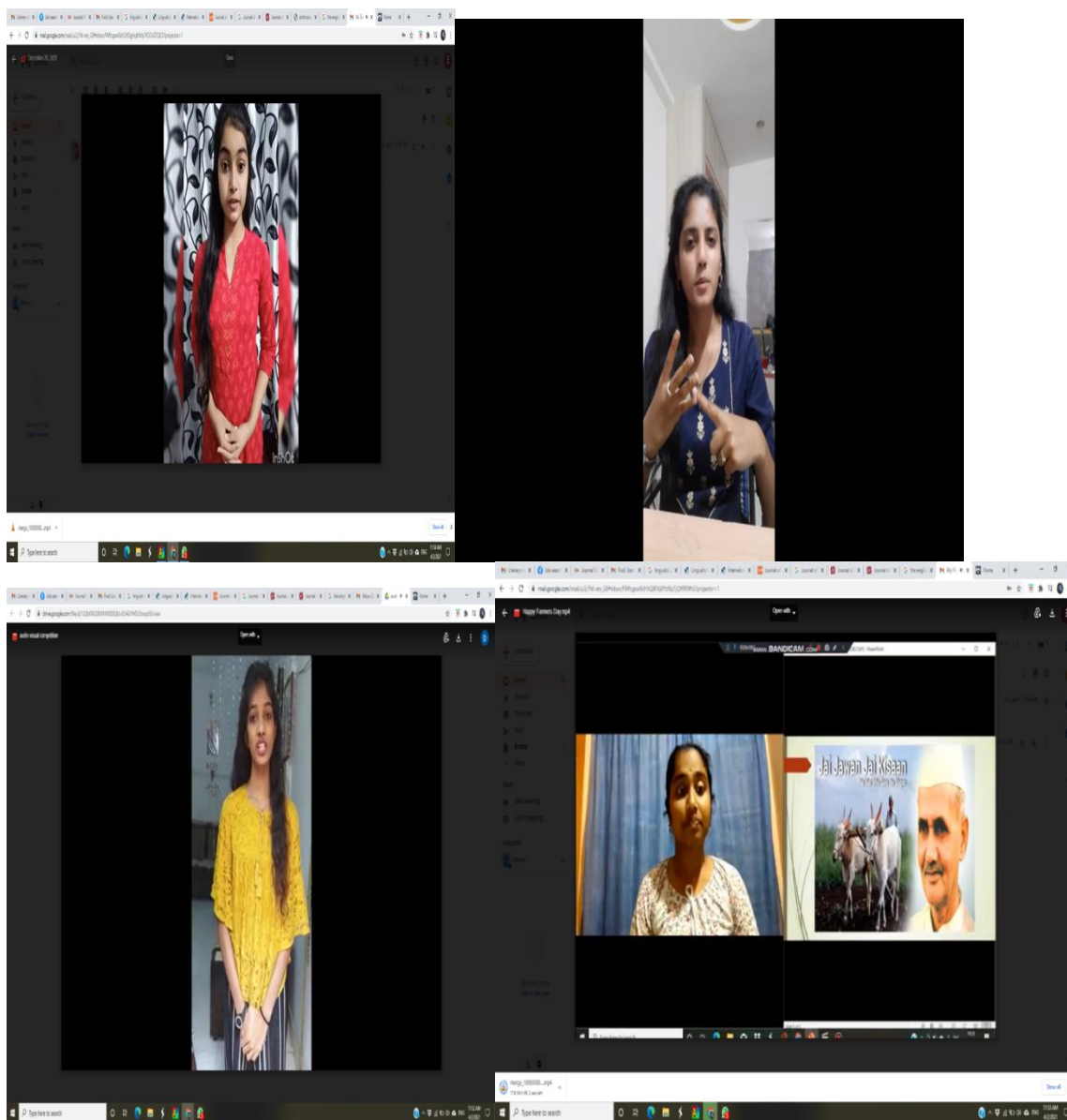
Voting can never be an option - it should be mandatory. Then we would not be counting percentage of vote polled, but only stating the margin of victory - truly for democracy.

And one among them being "BECOMING" by Michelle Obama has really been exhilarating.

"Now I think it's one of the most useless questions an adult can ask a child- what do you want to be when you grow up? As if growing up is finite. As if at some point you become something and that's the end". This quote an extract from the autobiography has touched me deeply as a child.

"BECOMING" is a 448 expansion of autobiography on what the politics deeply did to her (Michelle Obama) and how it has affected her professionally and personally and how it has helped her grow as a human and understand the problems that has been conquering the nation, even while explaining the worst scenarios she tends to give a positively-healthy cover up at the end.
